# Beyond the Book Activities The Snowy Day By Ezra Jack Keats

### Parents/Caregivers: Why do books matter? It all comes down to ABCs.

- <u>A</u> child deserves to be prepared: Educators emphasize that reading with your preschool child is one of the most important activities to prepare them for kindergarten.
- **Books are essential:** Studies by the National Assessment of Educational Progress organization have consistently found that the more reading material available in the home, the better students' reading levels are likely to be.
- <u>Cost of children not being prepared</u>: According to the Wilder Research, in Minnesota, the cost of children entering kindergarten unprepared is approximately \$113 million annually to school systems due to increased:
  - Student aid
  - Special education and grade repetition
  - o Teacher related costs
  - Impact on school safety due to delinquent behavior

Utilize the following activities to take you and your child(ren) beyond the book you just read.

### Supplies Needed

#### Activity 1

- Round objects
- White construction paper
- Blue construction paper
- Glue
- Markers
- Scissors

### Activity 2

- Coffee Filters
- Markers

#### Activity 3

Popsicle sticks

- Paint
- White paper

#### Activity 4

- Small bowls
- Ice cubes
- Kitchen timer

#### Activity 5

- Crayons or chalk
- Blue or black construction paper

#### Activity 6

• Paper plates

### \*Read book before getting ready for each activity.

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### Activity 1: Snow People

**Supplies you'll provide:** A variety of different sized round items (at least 3), markers, scissors, white construction paper and glue

### **Directions:**

- Set out the different sized round items.
- Have your child pick three different sizes.
- Have your child trace each size on white paper.
- Have your child cut out the circles they have traced.
- Have your child glue the circles, largest to smallest, onto the blue paper to create their snow person.
- Give your child markers and have them decorate the snow person they've made.

### Activity 2: Coffee Filter Snowflakes

Supplies you'll provide: Coffee filters and markers

### **Directions:**


- Give your child a coffee filter and markers.
- Instruct your child to color the coffee filter however they like.
- Have your child fold the coffee filter several times and cut out small section of it to make a snowflake.
- Have your child open the coffee filter to see their finished design.
- Make several snowflakes and display them around your house.
- Option: spray water on coffee filter with a mist spray bottle to make the color of the markers run together.

### Activity 3: Painting With Sticks

**Supplies you'll need:** Popsicle sticks (or small sticks from outside), paint and white paper

### **Directions:**

- Show your child the page where Peter finds a stick.
- Give your child a (craft) stick or have him find some small sticks outside.
- Explain to your child that they are going to drag these sticks like Peter did, but on paper instead of the ground.
- Show your child how to dab the stick into the paint and drag it across a piece of white paper.







### Activity 4: Melting Ice Cubes

Supplies you'll need: Small bowl, ice cubes and a kitchen timer

**Directions:** 

- Have your child place a few ice cubes into the small bowl.
- Set your kitchen timer to check the cubes every 10 minutes and see what is happening.
- Discuss with your child the changes that occur as the ice cubes melt.

### Activity 5: Snow Day Pictures

Supplies you'll need: Crayons or chalk and dark blue or black construction paper

**Directions:** 

- Have your child use chalk or crayons to draw a picture on black or blue paper.
- Have your child tell you about their picture.

## Activity 6: Ice Skating

Supplies you'll need: Paper plates

### **Directions:**

- Give your child paper plates.
- Have your child place a plate under each foot.
- Have your child move around the room, sliding their feet along as if they are skating.
